

Sandy, Tam 200, Thunderbird, Vona, and Newton complete the list of the top ten varieties with 3.1 percent, 2.7 percent, 2.4 percent, 2.2 percent and 1.7 percent of the acreage, respectively. The top ten varieties represented 85.9 percent of the state's total acreage seeded for the 1992 crop compared with 83.2 percent of the 1991 crop seeded acreage.
